Organizing a Community Litter Clean Up

The items listed below are in general order of sequence. Start with the first one and check the boxes as you finish each task; when all the boxes are checked you should be ready to go!

- Identify the project leader or leaders. **MAKE SURE THIS PERSON KNOWS THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PROJECT!**
- Choose a good date and time for your clean up. This should be a date *at least* a month away, with two to three months even better. Saturdays are the day you'll get the best turnout.
- Identify a "headquarters" for the clean-up day--firehouse, grange, town hall, etc. This place should have a large parking lot and shelter for volunteers and workers.
- Reserve the use of that place for that day. A letter requesting the use of that site is best.
- Contact your local transfer station or waste hauler to make arrangements for collected litter to be disposed of. Most will provide free disposal for such projects.**
- Determine how you'll get the bags of litter from your roadsides to the disposal site.**
- Make a list of the areas you want cleaned and prioritize the list.
- Identify clubs, service organizations, families, and businesses most likely to help.
- Contact these groups and ask them to help on your date.
- Estimate how many individuals will be cleaning and multiply that number by 2 to determine how many **BLUE BAGS** to order. **Town must be registered IN ADVANCE to receive free bags.**
- CALL or EMAIL New Hampshire the Beautiful at 603-736-4401 or nhtb@nrrarecycles.org with the time, date and amount of bags you will pick up. Be sure to bring your signed order form with you when you pick up your bags.**
- If possible, map the town or target area and color in the sections as you assign them.
- Assign someone to deal with refreshments. Coffee and doughnuts? Hot dogs? Sandwiches? Soda? Will you need a grill? Cups, plates, utensils, trash cans? Don't forget clean up!
- Ask local businesses if they will make donations of food and drinks for your cleanup day.
- Ask local newspapers and radio stations to publicize the day starting a month in advance.
- Make it easy for interested people to contact you – give phone numbers, email addresses, etc.

LITTER-FREE NEW HAMPSHIRE: HOW TO GET YOUR “FREE” BLUE BAGS

New Hampshire the Beautiful, Inc. is pleased to assist New Hampshire towns, cities, and individual groups with litter cleanup programs. If your community is not part of the **Litter-Free New Hampshire Program**, please contact our office to join.

SPECIFICATIONS:

- NHtB’s Litter Free program is only provided to towns/cities located in the state of New Hampshire.
- LIMIT 10 CASES per town.
- 150 bags per case.
- Each case approximately 10lbs

- CASES/BAGS CANNOT BE DELIVERED; Someone must coordinate to pick up up at the offices of **Northeast Resource Recovery Association (NRRRA), 2101 Dover Road, Epsom, NH, 03234.**

- BLUE BAGS ARE FREE; BUT ONLY AVAILABLE TO THOSE WHO REGISTER. **REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED.** Please contact NHtB for an update of current inventory on hand, see below for more pick-up details.

Individuals representing the town, city or group
can pick up the bags *only during the weekday hours of 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM.*

Please determine how many cases your group needs and:

1. **Call or email**

with day, time and number of cases you will be picking up.
Be sure to bring your signed order form with you when you pick up your bags.



DIRECTIONS TO NRRRA:

From I-93 North or South - Take Exit 15 E. off I-93 in Concord. This will turn onto I-393 East. Continue on I-393 which merges into Routes 4, 9 & 202 (Super Shoe’s outlet on the right hand side). Continue on Rte 4 for about 4 miles past Bobcat of NH. NRRRA is the driveway after White Mountain Cable on the right.

From East - Take Route 4 West. Approximately 1 mile after the Epsom traffic circle there will be the “Tool Shed” store. We are right across the street on the left. If you see Bobcat of NH you have gone too far.

From West - Take I-89 South to I-93 North to Exit 15 E off I-93 in Concord. This will turn onto I-393 East. Continue on I-393 which merges into Routes 4, 9 & 202 (Dexter Shoe Outlet on the right hand side). Continue on Rte 4 for about 4 miles past Bobcat of NH. NRRRA is the driveway after White Mountain Cable on the right.
